PTA VS. PTOs & Others

PTA is 5 million members strong networking and supporting ALL children.

Local groups are not focused on issues facing families nationwide.

PTA Reflections Program engages and encourages a half of a million plus students in the arts annually.

Local groups have limited resources that often do not include the arts.

PTA provides an online program to manage your membership, volunteers and more.

Other organizations must individually purchase costly database for these services.

PTA encourages everyone to get involved from parents to grandparents, neighbors, mentors, educators, business and community leaders.

Usually only parents are invited to become involved in supporting the school.

PTA Takes Action at the state and national level to get parents and citizens get involved in federal public policy.

Other organizations do not have a voice in Washington or an arsenal of policy experts to educate their members.

PTA partners with local and national businesses to offer its members discounts on retail and travel services and products.

At the state and national level other organizations have no partnerships, sponsorships or affiliations.

PTA has an ever-growing list of free national, state and local resources, programs and awards.

There are no national or state awards and all programs must be purchased or created locally.

PTA offers online training and in-person through national, and state conventions, local workshops, publications, e-learning and websites.

Any online resources require additional costs and there is no leadership training available to offer continuity in the group.

PTA offers all units in good standing has the IRS umbrella of nonprofit 501 C3 status.

Other organizations must individually purchase this benefit on the local level costing hundreds of dollars or pay taxes to the IRS on funds raised.
